This public right of way also includes land that may currently be

dedicated to the Federal or State government but that transports gas that is subject to this Franchise Agreement. However, should ONG lines be in a privately acquired easement dedicated to ONG or their subsidiaries, ONG would not be liable to remove these lines. This is applicable on a line-by-line basis.

B. Resolution No. <u>05-01-2023</u>, calling and holding a special election in the City of Del City for the purpose of granting a non-exclusive franchise to Oklahoma Natural Gas a division of One Gas, Inc. a franchise for the installation, operation and maintenance of a gas distribution system in the City of Del City and the selling of gas therein for a term of 25 years; authorize Mayor to endorse same; direct staff accordingly.
