4. **Public and Council Input**

A. Public:

- McKay Rorabaugh IAFF Local 2171 spoke of working with one of the most professional people that they have dealt with and gave examples. The person being referenced was never named.
- Andrew Bently- President of the Del City Police Union #114- Spoke about interactions with Kellie Wilbanks. Under the leadership of Interim Chief Taylor, they have seen positive things come out of what was a previously negative time. Keeping Kellie Wilbanks is important to keeping the positive momentum Chief Taylor has created going.

B. Council:

- Councilman Tatom attended the area Chamber of Commerce's Town Hall for Senator Lankford along with Micah Unruh our Street Department Supervisor who presented Senator Lankford with some street work that we'd like to get done in the future. Doesn't mind representatives from public works, police department and fire department coming here and speaking on their employees behalf, noticed several police officers that were present that didn't speak and asked why they were there and if they're being paid right now. City Manager Hock confirmed with Interim Chief Taylor that some are on the clock and some are not. Councilman Tatom said

he believes if they are on the clock, they should be on the streets working and not at a council meeting if their representative that has spoken for them can tell them what is going on.

- Councilman Browne – went to an ACOG meeting a couple weeks ago and was able to meet a Council member Tim Rudek from Harrah who wanted to send his thanks to the fire department for the ladder truck that was sent over. It is very appreciated by them. Good news that we were approved for Oldtown area pedestrian improvements and were awarded just over \$500,00.00 in grant money for that project.
- Councilman Dean- thank you to the streets department for being out continuously during the snowstorm. There are some wooden gates at our Mid Del Family Youth Center that we've purchased that are too big that is affecting the fence that needs attention. The Legislative luncheon was really good. He spoke with county representatives and would like to see us work with them to get the property at 29<sup>th</sup> and Sooner Road ready to have something nice there go in.
- Mayor Eason said that the Legislative Luncheon had a good turnout and congratulations to Joshua Schultz for running that event. Also had the Del City Rotary Club on Saturday and celebrated our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and it was a great event. Would like the striping at the post office to be looked into.
